



# House rules

## BC Schrobbeelaar

### ARTICLE 1: Membership

1. Membership of BC Schrobbeelaar goes per full basketball season (from September to June) and is tacitly renewed each time for a subsequent basketball season.
2. Membership can only be ended in writing (by e-mail or letter). The cancellation must have reached the board before the end of the basketball season that you are still in (therefore before July 1 of a calendar year). If not canceled in time, the membership will be extended for a subsequent season and the membership fee for that full season needs to be paid.
3. With a Schrobbeelaar membership you are entitled to at least 1 training per week during a basketball season, if it is possible to adhere to the opening hours of the USC on the fixed training days. The board decides on the location and time for training. Contrary to the above, a separate arrangement will be made with teams that train externally. In addition, the costs for renting an external location need to be paid by the external training team.
4. With a Schrobbeelaar membership you are also entitled to participate in a competition organized by the NBB / Rayon Noord-Holland during one basketball season, if the member is part of a team that is registered for such a competition. This right expires if the NBB / District Noord-Holland suspends or excludes the team, of which the member is a part, from participating in an organized competition. BC Schrobbeelaar is not liable for damage suffered as a result of

such a decision by the NBB / Rayon Noord-Holland.

5. The board can terminate the membership of a member at any time and / or deny a member access to training and / or competitions, if there are valid reasons for doing so. Valid reasons include, but are not limited to:
  - a) failure to pay membership fees and / or fines (on time) (Articles 2.4 and 3.5);
  - b) repeated failure to perform tasks
  - c) aggressive behavior towards other members, opponents or referees; grossly violating the house rules, the rules drawn up by the NBB / Rayon Noord-Holland and/or the rules drawn up by the university sports center (USC).

## ARTICLE 2: Contribution

1. Each member owes a contribution to BC Schrobbelaar per basketball season. The amount of the membership fee is determined at the general meeting of members per basketball season on the proposal of the board. The amount of the contribution can differ per team.
2. The full membership fee is due for a basketball season. No discount or refund of dues will be given, even if a member unsubscribes or is injured during a basketball season.
3. Payment of the membership fee is preferably done by direct debit. The contribution will be collected in 3 installments. If direct debit is not used, the member will receive an invoice for the total amount, which must be paid within 14 days. Each member will receive information by e-mail about the amount of the contribution and when it will be collected or should be transferred.
4. If the contribution is not paid within the set term, a fine of € 10 will be imposed and a payment reminder will be sent. In that case, the contribution must be paid within 14 days after the receiving of the reminder. If the membership fee is not

paid (on time) after the reminder, the board can decide in accordance with article 1.2 to deny the member in question access to training and / or competitions and to expel the member.

5. In exceptional cases, a payment arrangement can be made between the member and BC Schrobbeelaar. The board decides on this matter.

### ARTICLE 3: Tasks and fines

1. Each member is assigned tasks (acting as a referee or jury member) during the basketball season and is required to perform them. From the moment of assignment, the task falls under the responsibility of the relevant member.
2. If an assigned task is not performed by the member or by any replacement provided by him / her, a fine of € 25 will be imposed and the member concerned will be assigned a replacement task. For each subsequent time such a fine is needed to be imposed on the member concerned, the fine will be increased. This is done in the following steps. A second time not showing up, the fine is € 40. The third time not showing up, the fine is € 40, - and the member is suspended from the first home game. The fourth and last time means expulsion from the association for the member.
3. If a member (or his / her replacement) shows up too late for a task, this will be seen as a no-show and a fine is given in accordance with Article 3.2. Someone is "late" when the match to which the task relates has started without the member (or his / her substitute), or if the match in question is significantly delayed in anticipation of the member (or his / her substitute) incurred. Whether there the delay is seen as significant depends on the judgment of the board.
4. Fines can be imposed on BC Schrobbeelaar in accordance with the competition rules of the NBB / District Noord-Holland (available at <http://www.dunk.nl>). If possible, such fines will be passed on to the member / team who is responsible for the fine. When passed on to a team, the fine is divided among all members

of that team and is collected pro rata from the individual members.

5. An invoice for a (passed on) fine will be sent by e-mail. If a member has given permission for direct debit, the fine will be collected in this manner. In the absence of this permission, the invoice must be paid within 14 days of receipt. If payment is not made within this period, a reminder will be sent, and the fine will be increased by € 10. In that case, the invoice must be paid within 14 days after receiving the reminder. If the fine is not paid (on time) after the reminder, the board can expel the member concerned or deny him / her access to training sessions and / or competitions.
6. If a player is handed a disqualifying foul, BC Schrobbelaar will reimburse 50% of the administration costs charged by the NBB if the player has been declared innocent by the NBB disputes committee. This partial reimbursement by BC Schrobbelaar is only paid once per member.

#### ARTICLE 4: Referees

1. If a member is not in possession of a referee diploma level F, the member must participate in the F course offered by BC Schrobbelaar. There are no costs for the member.
  - a) To obtain the diploma, the member must be present for 3 half-days of 2.5 hours at the course location designated by BC Schrobbelaar. If the member (by judgement of the board) is absent without valid reason at one or more of these meetings, a fine of € 20 will be charged.
  - b) A member who is obliged to take the course, but does not obtain the diploma on the F-course offered by BC Schrobbelaar, will be assigned an additional task as a jury member three times in the season during which this obligation holds (in addition to the regularly assigned tasks) in accordance with article 2.1 and following.
2. Members in possession of a referee diploma level F are advised to participate in an E-course offered by the NBB / Rayon Noord-Holland. In consultation with

the board, it is possible that (part of) the costs of the course will be reimbursed by BC Schrobbelaar.

3. Teams that play at district level must provide district referees well in advance (before 1 August prior to the relevant basketball season) that meet the level required by the NBB / District Noord-Holland. The team in question is fully responsible for arranging aforementioned conditions. The fines imposed by the NBB / District of Noord-Holland for not complying with the aforementioned obligation are imposed on the team concerned and are collected in accordance with Article 2.
4. If a district referee does not show up at a match that is assigned to him or her, BC Schrobbelaar will be fined by the NBB / District Noord-Holland. Such fines will be passed on to members of the responsible team in accordance with Article 2. Any recovery of such fines from the referee in question is the responsibility of the team.

#### ARTICLE 5: Games and jerseys

1. The (regular) day of the home game is determined by the board per season. A preference for the day that the home game takes place can be stated no later than 1 August prior to the season to which the request relates. The board takes a final decision on the location and time of the game.
2. Each team is obliged to ensure that competitions organized by the NBB / District Noord-Holland for the respective team can take place. If a team cannot participate in a match, the match secretary of BC Schrobbelaar and the match secretary of the opposing team should be contacted no later than 3 weeks before the match concerned, with a request to reschedule the match, providing alternative match days. If it becomes apparent during the last 3 weeks before the start of the game that no team will be present, the team must contact a) the game secretary of BC Schrobbelaar as soon as possible; and b) a match secretary / contact person of the opposing team to notify that the match will be

canceled. It is the responsibility of the team concerned that the match is moved in consultation with the opposing team.

3. BC Schrobbelaar colors from BC Schrobbelaar are black and yellow. The uniforms (pants and shirt) of BC Schrobbelaar are therefore either black with a yellow band along the longitudinal axis, or yellow with a black band along the longitudinal axis.
4. Every new member of BC Schrobbelaar who plays / will play matches, is obliged to purchase a Schrobbelaar outfit. The cost of a uniform differ every season and this amount must be paid (in cash) prior to obtaining the uniform. Alternatively, a member can buy a kit from a former player, as long as the kit number does not correspond with any other kit number in the team. It is the responsibility of each member that he / she wears the official BC Schrobbelaar outfit during competitions.
5. After purchasing a kit, the member concerned is responsible for the quality of the kit. The board can oblige a member to purchase a new outfit if, by judgment of the board, the kit of the member concerned is no longer in sufficient condition.
6. Damage to a uniform will not be reimbursed by BC Schrobbelaar. If a kit is damaged (during a match), it is the responsibility of the kit owner to arrange a new / repaired kit and possibly recover any damage from the person who damaged the kit.

#### ARTICLE 6: The board

1. The house rules can be amended or withdrawn by the general meeting of members at the proposal of the board. An amendment or the withdrawal of the house rules will be made public via the website of BC Schrobbelaar (<http://www.bcschrobbelaar.nl>). The change or withdrawal is effective as soon as the general meeting has taken a decision to that effect and the change or

withdrawal has been published as aforementioned.

2. The board can appoint an additional director with a two-thirds (2/3) majority of the votes. A director appointed by the board cannot be the chairman, the treasurer or the secretary.
3. The board can dismiss an individual director at any time. A resolution to that effect must be taken unanimously in a board meeting in which all board members are represented, with the exception of the board member whose resignation is to be decided. The director whose dismissal is being decided has the right to attend and address the meeting.
4. Each team is obliged to nominate a member from the respective team as a director in the general meeting in which it is decided to appoint the board / a director. If a team does not meet the aforementioned obligation, the board is authorized to deny the members of the respective team access to competitions and / or training. This authority lapses if the team in question nominates a team member as a director after all, for appointment by the board or the general meeting.
5. The directors fulfill the function of chairman, treasurer, secretary, webmaster, member administrator and competition secretary respectively. If there are more positions than board members, one director can fulfill several functions, on the understanding that the functions of chairman, treasurer and secretary are incompatible. If there are more board members than positions, the surplus acts as general director. The board can decide on a further division of tasks.
6. A director is appointed for 12 months on 1 July of each calendar year. A retiring director can be re-elected immediately. A general meeting for the appointment of the board / directors must be held in May or June of each calendar year. The directors are individually responsible for the transfer of duties to the person who will fulfill his / her respective position as referred to in article 5.5 after him / her.

## ARTICLE 7: Liability

1. BC Schrobbelaar cannot be held liable for physical or psychological damage incurred during training or competitions. The same applies to such damage incurred in the context of training sessions or competitions, including but not limited to: en route to, en route from, prior to and after training or competitions.
2. BC Schrobbelaar cannot be held liable for material damage or theft of property incurred during training or competitions. The same applies to such damage incurred in the context of training sessions or competitions, including but not limited to: en route to, en route from, prior to and after training or competitions.
